



Amazon Prime Day is today and tomorrow. Once again, cyber criminals are busy sending requests and special "deals" that are scams. If you get any Prime Day offers in email, on your phone, or via social media remember these things:

- Carefully look out for incorrect grammar, punctuation, and any misspellings of email addresses, ads, and domain names
- . If you're asked to provide additional details (e.g. your birthday or social security number), it is most likely a scam

 Make sure to have strong passwords on all of your accounts
- Use two-factor authentication whenever possible such as a texted PIN or challenge questions

 Use a Credit Card instead of a Debit Card
- . Don't use emailed links! Go directly to the vendor you need to access from your
