FTC (Federal Trade Commission) Consumer Sentinel Network Data Book 2020, of 4.7 million

Network Data Book 2020, of 4.7 million complaints received that year, 2.2 million were fraud-related. This resulted in a \$3.3 billion loss — an increase of nearly \$1.5 billion from 2019. It can be hard to detect online fraud as scammers are constantly changing their tactics and techniques. However, there are some simple steps you can take to protect yourself.
